

Noyce Mathematics Master Teaching Fellowship

California State University, Fullerton

The Fullerton Mathematics Teacher and Master Teacher Fellows Project at California State University, Fullerton is accepting applications for Robert Noyce Mathematics Master Teaching Fellowships. Funded by the National Science Foundation and in collaboration with Santa Ana College, Anaheim Union High School District, Norwalk-La Mirada Unified School District and the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards, this project has as one of its goals the preparation of expert mathematics teachers to become Master Teachers and teacher leaders in their districts and participants in teacher preparation through involvement with the university and community college.

One cohort of ten Fellows will:

- Participate in master teacher and mentor training
- Serve as master teachers and mentors to new teachers
- Participate in professional development activities
- Provide leadership in their district
- Collaborate with the university and community college in recruitment and preparation of mathematics teachers
- Complete requirements for National Board Certification
- Receive \$50,000 in salary supplements (\$10,000 each of five years)

Program Requirements

- Successful completion of all requirements of the Fullerton Mathematics Teacher and Master Teacher Fellows Project
- Successful completion of National Board Certification requirements
- Teach in a high-need district during their five years in the Project

Eligibility and Application Requirements

- Mathematics teaching position in a high-need district
- Master's degree in Mathematics, Secondary Education, or comparable field
- Evidence of teaching effectiveness
- Evidence of leadership capacity
- Evidence of content knowledge (passage of CSETs 110 and 111 or equivalent)
- Two letters of recommendation documenting teaching effectiveness, leadership capacity, and disposition toward teaching in high-need schools
- A personal statement of no more than 500 words indicating your interest in and commitment to teaching mathematics in a high-need school district
- U.S. citizen, U.S. national, or permanent resident status
